

ONE horse SERVES 5-8 participants weekly across all programs

ONE horse receives seasonal worming/vaccinations, physical exams, body work and teeth floated EACH YEAR to maintain good health. YEARLY COST: \$300-\$400




ONE horse requires a hoof trim (\$50) or new set of shoes (\$180) every 6 weeks.



ONE horse requires 10-15 GALLONS of clean water per day



ONE horse consumes 600 POUNDS of hay a month. Yearly cost for hay and supplements \$7,200




Horses offer unconditional support; they do not judge or laugh, making them excellent partners for building emotional regulation and self-awareness.




Revenue Sources
